THE NATIONAL FRAMEWORK OF QUALIFICATIONS

You do not necessarily have to follow each step; it is possible to skip steps at the beginning of your journey depending on what you want to do and your capabilities in your chosen course of study.

For Example;

STUDENT FINANCE

www.studentfinance.ie (SUSI) provides information on course fees and details on eligibility requirements for free fees and maintenance grants. You will also find out all you need to know about other sources of assistance for students, such as the Fund for Students with Disabilities, the Back to Education Allowance and the Student Assistance Fund.

Students on part-time courses, access or foundation courses (in higher education institutions) or short term courses are usually not eligible to apply for a student grant.

For eligible students, the grant is there to help with the various costs of participating in further or higher education.

Family and/or personal income and circumstances are key factors that will be assessed when you apply for a student grant.

There are a number of return to education schemes available to people receiving social welfare payment. You will need to discuss options with a Department of Social Protection Case Officer to determine your eligibility and the college will have to fill in some paperwork also.

The main schemes are • VTOS • BTEA • Springboard/Momentum

Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (V.T.O.S.)

VTOS is the main second-level adult education programme which allows you to keep your social welfare payment and return to education. Programmes are full-time and are run by the Education and Training Boards.

To qualify for VTOS you must be:

aged 21 or over and getting either Jobseeker's Benefit or Jobseeker's Allowance for 6 months or signing on for credits for 6 months. Your spouse or partner may also qualify for VTOS.

BTEA - Back to Education Allowance

The BTEA scheme lets you keep your social welfare payment and return to approved full-time education.

You may also
qualify for BTEA if you
have been getting certain
social welfare payments such
as the One-Parent Family
payment. You must be getting a
qualifying social welfare
payment immediately
before you start the
course.

To qualify for the second-level option, you must be:

21 years of age or over and have been getting Jobseeker's Benefit or Jobseeker's Allowance for at least 3 months.

18 to 20 years of age, out of formal education for at least 2 years and getting a Jobseeker's payment for at least 3 months.

To qualify for the 3rd Level option you must be:

21 years of age or over and have been getting a Jobseeker's payment for at least 9 months

18 to 20 years of age, out of formal education for at least 2 years and getting a Jobseeker's payment for at least 9 months.

If you are applying for a third level post graduate course you must be at least 24 years of age.

GOVERNMENT FUNDED EDUCATIONAL SCHEMES

Springboard

This programme provides places on part-time higher education courses. The courses range from certificate to master's degree levels.

To qualify for Springboard, you must:

Be in receipt of Jobseeker's Benefit, Jobseeker's Allowance or other social welfare payments; or be signing for social insurance credits; and have a history of employment; and be actively seeking work.

You may also qualify if you:

Are on short-time working and getting a Jobseeker's payment; or were previously self-employed.

Course Fees

You do not have to pay course fees or charges while you are unemployed You will continue to get your existing social welfare payment while taking part in Springboard.

To apply go to the website: www.springboardcourses.ie Choose the course(s) you are interested in and apply online. Follow the instructions on the website.



Momentum

Momentum will fund free education and training projects to allow jobseekers (who are unemployed for 12 months or more) to gain skills and to access work opportunities in identified growing sectors.

You must contact your Local Employment Services Office to check and confirm your eligibility.

To be eligible, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be unemployed for 12 months or longer
- Be in receipt of Jobseeker's Allowance/Benefit or on the Live Register for 12 months or longer (signing on for Social Insurance Contribution Credits for 12 months or longer) and
- Be actively seeking work

Applying for Jobs

Once you have spotted the job you want you will need to spend some time preparing your application. Contact the Local Employment Service/Clondalkin Youth Service for help with writing covering letters, filling out application forms, updating your C.V. and preparing for interviews.

SCHEMES TO SUPPORT EMPLOYMENT

There is a range of employment schemes and other supports for people who have been on unemployment or certain other social welfare payments for a specific period of time. Each scheme has different rules as to who is eligible so it is important to check the detailed information about each scheme before applying. If you are returning to work through one of these schemes your social welfare payment may be affected in different ways, depending on the scheme. People on certain disability payments may qualify for the schemes and there are a number of employment sup-

The Back to Work Enterprise Allowance (BTWEA) scheme assists unemployed people and others getting certain social welfare payments to become self-employed. People who are setting up their own business and who qualify for the BTWEA scheme may retain a percentage of their social welfare payment for up to 2 years.

Short-Term Enterprise Allowance

The Short-Term Enterprise Allowance (STEA) provides support to people getting Jobseeker's Benefit (JB) who want to start their own business. The Short-Term Enterprise Allowance is paid instead of your JB and there is no qualifying period, which means you do not need to be getting JB for a certain length of time.

LOOKING FOR WORK

Part-Time Job Incentive

The Part-Time Job Incentive (PTJI) scheme is for people who have been getting Jobseeker's Allowance for 15 months or more. It allows them to take up part-time work and get a Part-Time Job Allowance instead of the Jobseeker's Allowance. Information about how to qualify for the Part-Time Job Incentive Scheme can be found on the Department of Social Protection website or in your local DSP Intreo office.

Community Employment

The Community Employment programme provides long-term unemployed and other disadvantaged people with training and work experience through part-time and temporary placements in jobs based within local communities. There are two different categories of Community Employment: the Part-Time Integration Option and the Part-Time Job Option. Please contact your local DSP Intreo Office to apply for a CE position.

TÚS

The TÚS scheme is a community work placement initiative providing work opportunities which benefit the community. TÚS places are provided by community and voluntary organisations in both urban and rural areas. Unemployed people who are eligible to participate in the scheme are selected and contacted by the Department of Social Protection.

•••••

JobBridge - National Internship Scheme

JobBridge, National Internship Scheme provides internship placements for unemployed people in private, public, community and voluntary organisations. Participants must be on the Live Register for 3 months and the internships will last from 6 to 9 months. If you take up an internship you will keep your social welfare payment and will get an extra €50 per week.

Work Placement Programme

The Work Placement Programme provides 9 months' work experience for unemployed people. The Programme provides places in the private, public, community and voluntary sectors. Participants do not have to be getting a social welfare payment but participants who are getting certain social welfare payments for 3 months may keep their payment.
